The ClimateSmart Cities Assessment Framework was launched on 11 September 2020 with an aim to provide a clear roadmap for cities to combat climate change and implement necessary actions. The assessment process completed a rigourous three-month journey this week, which encompassed engaging with 126 cities and 40+ organisations. Looking back at the entire process, the Climate Centre for Cities (C-Cube) team and its partners have reflected upon their experience and the learnings. Together they hope the knowledge gathered in this journey will enable the cities to work towards a greener, sustainable, and resilient urban development.
