

# **Support to Uttarakhand for Scale-up of FSSM Solutions**




## Why FSSM in Uttarakhand

Two-third of toilets in urban Uttarakhand do not have access to sewerage network as per Census 2011. Further, only six out of the state's 91 Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) have more than 50% of households connected to the sewerage network. This implies a significant dependence on onsite sanitation systems (OSS) such as septic tanks and pits.

At present, there is no system for regular collection, conveyance, treatment, and safe disposal and reuse of faecal sludge and septage generated in these sanitation systems. Currently, unregulated and ad-hoc nature of these services poses major public health and environmental risk. Therefore, there is an urgent need to streamline Faecal Sludge and Septage Management (FSSM) services in the state.

## GOAL

To streamline nonsewered sanitation solutions including FSSM in Uttarakhand through research, capacity development, technical support, and policy & advisory support



#### What We Do

Sanitation Capacity Building Platform (SCBP) supports the Government of Uttarakhand's Urban Development Directorate (UDD) to move from ODF to ODF++.

SCBP provides support to select ULBs for FSSM pilot projects, and works closely with the UDD, Peyjal Nigam and Jal Sansthan for developing FSSM state strategies through policy advisories and investment plans.

SCBP provides technical assistance in the form of DPRs, feasibility reports and city assessment plans; organises capacity development of key officials through training programs and workshops; and strengthens institutional capacity of nodal training institutes (DRST UAoA) and academic institutes (IIT Roorkee) in the state.


