The National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG) and the National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA) along with other partners have pioneered the work in this regard and have created several enabling frameworks and guidance documents for proliferating river-sensitive development in our cities. The stage is now set for onthe-ground action.

The River Cities Alliance (RCA) has been conceptualized to serve as an avenue for precisely this purpose.



Member Cities


