Launch of the Historic River Cities Alliance

25 November 2021 marked the launch of the **River Cities Alliance (RCA)**, a first-of-its kind initiative in the world. Established by NIUA and the National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG), the Alliance is meant to serve as platform for *river cities* in India to ideate, discuss, exchange, and co-create solutions for sustainable urban river management.

To begin with, 30 cities from 11 States have been included in the RCA. These include Ayodhya, Aurangabad, Bhagalpur, Begusarai, Bijnor, Berhampore, Bhubaneswar, Chennai, Dehradun, Rishikesh, Haridwar, Srinagar, Munger, Hooghly-Chinsurah, Patna, Howrah, Maheshtala, Jangipur, Rajmahal, Farrukhabad, Sahibganj, Kanpur, Mathura-Vrindavan, Prayagraj, Mirzapur, Pune, Varanasi, Vijayawada, and Udaipur. More cities will be added as the Alliance evolves.

The Hon'ble Minister for Jal Shakti, Shri Gajendra Singh Shekhawat, presided over the launch ceremony along with Secretary-MoHUA, Secretary-Jal Shakti, Director General-NMCG, and Director-NIUA. The Commissioners/Executive Officers and senior officials from the members cities were also present for the ceremony that was organised in New Delhi. NIUA and NMCG will serve as the Secretariat for the RCA initially until the Alliance evolves to become a fully city-led movement. To read in detail about the event, click <u>here</u>.
