Faecal Sludge Treatment Plant now Operational in Port Blair



The Faecal Sludge Treatment Plant (FSTP) for the city of Port Blair is now fully operationalised. NIUA's Sanitation Capacity Building Platform (SCBP) Programme had prepared the detailed project report for the FSTP in collaboration with ECOSAN Services Foundation. The plant is a combination of decentralised waste water and sewerage treatment solutions with a total treatment capacity of 42 kilo liters per day. For details on Port Blair FSTP click here.


