Pilot Study on Community Embedded Decision Support System for Bhopal Launched

The Smart Data and Inclusive Cities (SDIC) project at NIUA launched the Community Embedded Decision Support System (CEDSS) in Bhopal on 8 October. The pilot was launched in collaboration with the Institute of Development Studies, University of Sussex, UK as anchor institutions along with GRADE, Peru as Technology partner, and Samarthan, Bhopal as community partner. CEDSS is an algorithm-based decision support systems which suggests solutions to empower citizens for improving disaster response, and emergency preparedness. It will help integrate multiple forms of data within the Integrated Command and Control Centre (ICCC) for a more efficient urban governance, management, and planning.
